**Score Choice allows students to add, change or remove a college or a scholarship program from their score report within nine days of taking the test. Four additional flexible score reports are available for fee waiver recipients.

Payment must be made in U.S. dollars and in the form of a check, money order, or credit card (American Express, Discover, MasterCard, or Visa). Checks and money orders should be made payable to "The College Board." Insufficient payment will cause your scores to be delayed. Checks returned to the College Board for insufficient funds will be re-presented electronically and your account will be debited for the amount of the check, plus the state-allowed penalty fee.

Fee Waivers can only be used if you register by the regular registration deadline. Fee waivers cannot be used for late registration except for the October test date. Fee waivers cannot be used for standby registrations. See back for more details.

** Test Date Change fee is for a different date only if absent on original date. If you request a test date change after the regular deadline for the new date, you must **also** add the late fee. Test Center Change Fee is for same date. If both need changing, you are charged for each.

*** processed within one week after your request is received. ACT delivers these to colleges and agencies you've selected depending on their preferred schedule—at least every two weeks

**** Normally processed within two working days after ACT receives your request and usually delivered 3-4 business days later.

Fee Waivers can be used to cover the basic test fee for ACT No Writing or ACT Plus Writing for up to two tests (including those for which the student is absent). Waivers do not cover the late registration fee, test date or test center changes, standby fee, or any other services. See back for more details.

About Fee Waivers

Waivers cannot be requested directly from ACT or SAT by the student. Only counselors or an authorized agency can grant fee waivers. Fee Waivers can be requested through the Counselor HelpLine: 800-553-6244 (ACT) and 888-SAT-HELP. Have your CEEB code ready. If you do not have one, the HelpLine will also direct you on how to get one.

SAT Fee Waivers cover

- Basic test fees for SAT or SAT Subject Tests. You must register by the regular registration deadline. Fee waivers cannot be used for late registration except for the October test date. Fee waivers cannot be used for standby registrations.
- Four additional score reports
- Either the Question-and-Answer Service (QAS) or the Student Answer Service (SAS) when ordered during registration
- Application fee waivers at many colleges, if the institution has agreed to cooperate with the SAT Program Fee-Waiver Service
- A discount on the Official SAT Online Course™ when ordered during an online registration
- Four total waivers per a student: two for the SAT and two for the SAT Subject Tests. Subject Test waivers can be used from 9th grade through graduation. SAT fee waivers can be used from 11th grade through graduation.

ACT Fee Waivers cover

- The basic registration fee for your test option, including up to four college choices (if you provide valid codes when you register). Waivers do not cover the late registration fee, test date or test center changes, or any other fees or services. If you are eligible, you may use up to two fee waivers total. The waiver is used once you register, even if you do not test on the requested test date.

Eligibility for SAT & ACT Fee Waivers

- An American citizen or a foreign national testing in the United States, Puerto Rico, or U.S. territories, or an American citizen living outside the United States
- A high school junior or senior
- Meets the financial eligibility guidelines. The fee waiver guidelines, combined with the high school counselor's knowledge of circumstances of individual students, will help determine which students are eligible. Eligibility for the Federal Free and Reduced Lunch Program is below.

Please note:

- The household size is the number of dependents and the filer on the family's current tax statement.
- Students in foster care are considered a household size of one person.

More than six dependents

For 2011-2012, add \$6919 to Annual Income for each additional dependent.

Other criteria for identifying eligible students

- The student is a member of a family receiving public assistance.
- The student is a resident in a federally subsidized public housing project.
- The student is a resident in a foster home.
- The student is enrolled in a program for the economically disadvantaged, such as Federal Free or Reduced Lunch, Upward Bound/TRIO after-school, and other youth outreach programs.
