

CTQ-Rollover Buttons

To start my rollover button CTQ, I opened a blank Photoshop page, and began by making a rectangular box using the marquee tool, I found out that the best way to make the button look nice is to insert a nice wooden background so that it can blend with the fade of the button. After making the box I added some text that said "click here!", and I made it look flat. Finally, I had to save it as a JPG or a PNG file, but I decided to go with JPG's. When I was done with this picture I found out that to make a button tool I need to have two images that look the same but the second one we must use the bevel tool to make the text look like it is on a higher level . After I had the two pictures done, I had to do something that would enable it to change pictures when I press on the first button, so I asked around and found out that the best way to do it is by using a program that can use codes to construct a picture that is animated from two other pictures. The program that I used was office FrontPage. First of all I did not know how to use the code because I never learned how to use it before , so I just took the easy way and did it manually by selecting both images and setting the second one to appear onmouseover , then it worked. Later on I found out that some students used the code and it worked perfectly in the HTML part, so I thought about it and searched for some information online so that I can be able to use it and finally I found out that it is as simple as only copying a code and changing a small part of it where the image file location goes! This is how I analyzed my ideas to make a rollover button the official way.
